### REQUEST

Public Works Department is requesting City Commission action to approve execution of the Revised Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). This agreement will replace the current Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement executed in 2002

#### <u>PURPOSE</u>

This agenda request is needed to replace the existing FDOT Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement through Commission Action

## **CONSIDERATIONS**

The implementation of this revised agreement is in the best interests of the City of Daytona Beach by providing additional FDOT reimbursement for various FDOT traffic signal components such as the telecommunication links between traffic signals and the Traffic Management Center located in Public Works.

The revised reimbursement amount would be \$228,000.00 versus \$133,000.00 under the current agreement. Additionally yearly increases will be based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

Additionally this authorizes the City Manager to update any and all amendments to Exhibit A of this agreement on behalf of the City of Daytona Beach as the maintaining agency of FDOT traffic signals and related components.

If approved by the City Commission and after execution please return the three signed documents to Public Works Department for transmittal to the Florida Department of Transportation.

## **FUNDING**

No City funding is required.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

The Deputy Public Works Director and Traffic Division Administrator recommend approval of this revised FDOT Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement.
