ORDINANCE NO. 96-409

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF CYPRESS STREET TO GEORGE W. ENGRAM BOULEVARD; AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT.

WHEREAS, Commissioner Remark has proposed that the name of Cypress Street be changed to George W. Engram Boulevard in honor of George W. Engram, in recognition of th personal and civic leadership provided by Mr. Engram; and

WHEREAS, Mr. George W. Engram, Sr., came to The City of Daytona Beach in 1933 and has been a leading member of th community ever since. In 1934, Mr. Engram became the first African-American in the State of Florida to be licensed as an Electrical Contractor and opened the first Electrical Company owned and operated by an African-American. In addition to his numerous activities in the business community, Mr. Engram has been a leader in civic matters, and serves as an exemplary role model within the community; and

WHEREAS, petitions have been submitted showing gr at community support for the renaming of the streets in honor of this outstanding citizen of Daytona Beach; and

WHEREAS, the proposed name change meets the policy for street names adopted by Resolution No. 95-17.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That right-of-way located within The City of Daytona Beach currently known as Cypress Street extending from Seneca Street to Segrave Street, is hereby renamed and d signated George W. Engram Boul vard. The City Engin er is

her by directed to use the name Georg W. Engram Boul vard on all future City maps.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect on as provided by law.
