<p>STRATEGIC PLANNING INITIATIVE: <u>Infrastructure: To ensure that the citizens of Daytona Beach have the services and infrastructure needed to maintain and enhance their quality of life.</u></p>	
<p>BACKGROUND: <u>Utilities Department requests the City Commission adopt a resolution authorizing a purchase from Thompson Pump & Manufacturing Co., Inc., 4620 City Center Drive, Port Orange, Florida 32119 in the amount of \$92,188.00 for an emergency bypass pump for Lift Station No. 69.</u></p> <p><u>This request is needed to purchase an emergency bypass pump for Lift Station No. 69 to provide backup pumping in case of a pump failure or power outage.</u></p> <p><u>Lift Station No. 69 is located west of the intersection of Mason Avenue and Bill France Blvd and provides wastewater collection service to surrounding customers including B Braun, a large industrial wastewater generator. Lift Station No. 69 does not currently have a backup generator; if there is a power failure, City staff must go out to the site and install a portable generator to power the lift station. In an emergency, such as a hurricane or other significant weather event, City staff is required to take time away from other emergencies to install a portable generator at Lift Station No. 69 to maintain operation. Installation of a permanent bypass pump at Lift Station No. 69 would provide a reliable backup source to maintain operation. The bypass pump has the additional benefit of providing a redundant pump in case of pump failure at Lift Station No. 69.</u></p> <p><u>Thompson Pump has a Florida based government contract derived from their 2018 Florida Sheriffs Association Contract Bid Award. The City is able to utilize the net price from the contract to purchase the bypass pump by referencing the FSA contract number (FSA-18-VEH16.0, Spec #081) on the purchase order.</u></p> <p><u>Funds are available in Account No. 428-610000-536-565000-611802.</u></p>
